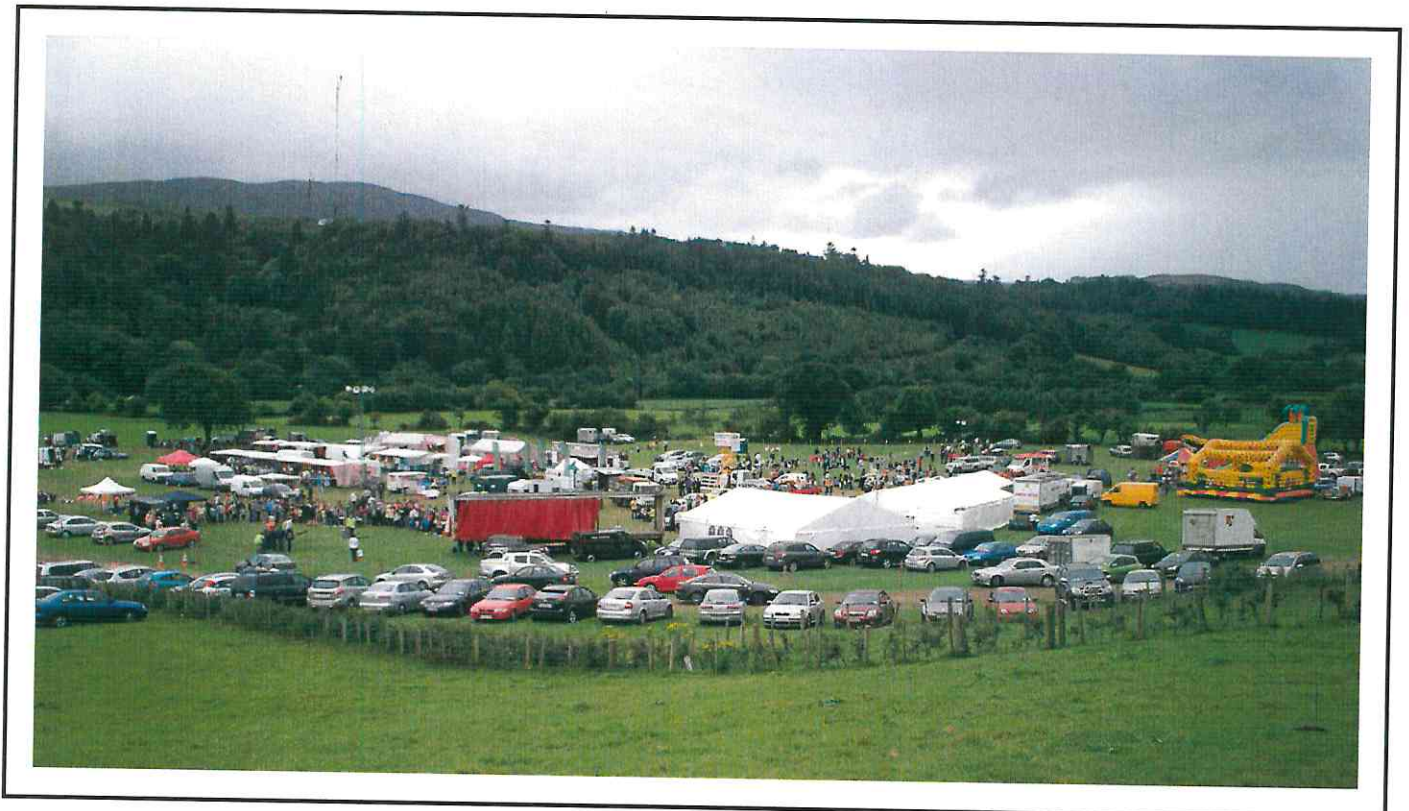

IRISH SHOW ASSOCIATION LTD GENERAL RULES 2023

Responsibility of Shows holding qualifying rounds

1. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify
2. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
3. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes
4. Shows may charge an entry fee for each qualifying class, the ISA will award a rosette to the successful Qualifier on appearance at the final
5. A Show hosting a Championship Final may not hold a qualifying class for that championship on the day of the final other than by agreement with the ISA, however, shows who hold qualifiers for Horses, Ponies, Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show.
6. Shows should not undertake to host a qualifier unless they have an equivalent class
7. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the show where the final is held other than a qualifying class for another competition
8. Shows should appoint competent persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete & those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
9. where shows debar class winners from further competitions, this rule must be applied to qualifiers
10. On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend the Shows Secretary's office within one hour & complete the necessary paperwork.
11. The Show must appoint a well briefed officer who will be available at the Secretary's Office, to assist exhibitors to complete the entry cards for participation in the final & to collect the entry fee.
12. Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards together with appropriate fees to the ISA within three days following the holding of the show (N.B. Shows must return results cards marked "No Entry" for any or all of the events for which no animal or exhibit has been selected.

Responsibility of Exhibitors

- A. Exhibitors accept that the Judge's decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or cause for complaint arises, the matter should only be dealt with under the section D below.
- B. Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their qualifier (or exhibit) for the final in accordance with the rules above within one hour of qualifying.

C. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final

D. The ISA in conjunction with the sponsor reserves the right to alter or amend the rules of the competition as may be necessary where appropriate.

E. Shows and competitors must contact the ISA National Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.

F. Objections must be lodged in writing with the ISA representative at the show or the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of Judging. Together with a fee of €50 or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

G. Any exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibits is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prize awarded.

Responsibilities of Shows hosting Championships Finals & All Irelands.

A. Where Shows are paying prizes a deduction of 5% of the prize money will be collected by the Shows and forwarded to the ISA within 30 days of final.

B. Championships finals must start not later than 2pm on the day of the show and the advertised time must be adhered to as far as practicable, If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this

C. Shows should co-operate with the ISA personnel and judges appointed to officiate at finals.

D. Selection of judges for All-Ireland Championships should be handled by the relevant sub-committee of the board of the ISA.

E. Exhibitors should be familiar with the ISA disciplinary policy as published on our website & annual guidebook.

Eligibility of Shows to host Qualifiers

1. Have collected the Championship fund (currently 5%) from Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Goats, classes. Prize money for the previous year & forwarded the amount so collected in full to the ISA within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of the show, alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable, any show competitor in breach of the rules set out will be disqualified for the championship.

2. Undertake to ensure the correct collection & return of qualifier cards and entry fees.

3. These general rules & those relating to individual championships where applicable should be published in the shows schedule & catalogue of the participating shows must be strictly observed.



RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1.** Open & Confined: Confined events refer to the Kenmare rural area & Clonkeen. The open events refer to confined area plus all other areas.
- 2.** Any handler whose animal is not in his/her control may be asked to remove said animal from the arena/show grounds, at the discretion of the judge or Stewards.
- 3.** Prize Winners: i.e., 1st, 2nd 3rd, in all classes. Prize money will be posted to exhibitors four weeks after the show.
- 4.** All exhibits must be owned by the person exhibiting at the Show, otherwise they will be disqualified.
- 5.** Persons making entries and failing to send exhibits shall forfeit all entry fees paid.
- 6.** The Horticultural, Home Craft and Children's section entries must be handed into the Marquee with entry fees on the evening prior to the Show **from 4:00 – 8:00pm.**
- 7.** All other entries, other than the afore-mentioned will be accepted at the show-ground on the day or prior to entering the show ring.
- 8.** All vehicles in Show grounds are parked at owners' risk, no responsibility is accepted for loss or damage to property.
- 9.** Admission at Gate: Adults €10.
- 10.** The Committee will take the utmost care of all exhibits. However, it will not accept responsibility for any accident, loss or damage to livestock or property.
- 11.** Judge's decision will be final in all categories. If an exhibitor gives a judge hassle, he may be disqualified.
- 12.** Fireworks, Pellet guns, Bangers, Spray paint, Balloons, Bubbles, Stink Bomb are not to be sold at Trade Stands. Trade Stands found to be selling these products will be removed from the show ground.
- 13.** The winners of cups in 2023 must give an under-taking in writing to the Committee that the cups will be handed up to the Secretary before 1st June 2024 in as good condition as they were received.
- 14.** No exhibits may be removed until 4pm on Show Day or without the permission from the Chairperson.
- 15.** Objections in any class must be lodged in writing with the Secretary before 5:00pm on the day of the Show by a fee of €50. The fee to be returned if the objection is upheld. Objections will be considered at the first meeting of the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 16.** The Committee reserves the right to reject or return any entry without assigning a reason, to cancel the class or competition, or to postpone the Show, to remove any animal or exhibit at any time during the Show and shall not be liable for compensation or otherwise arising out of the holding or abandonment or alteration of the date of Show.
- 17.** The Show Committee reserves the right to replace or substitute any prize money, by cup, trophy or nomination, or vice versa.
- 18.** Perpetual Trophies & Cups can never be won outright.
- 19.** Kilgarvan Show is run under the rules of the Irish Show Association.
- 20.** All Animals to be led. The Society shall have to order the removal of any animal that they consider to be dangerous and shall not be responsible for any injury or damage caused by such animals.
- 21.** In the Livestock Section – any class for which only one entry is received will be cancelled.
- 22.** The society shall not be responsible for any mistakes in the entry forms or catalogue
- 23.** Judge's names will not be disclosed prior to the show.
- 24.** All cheques, money orders & postal orders to be made out to Kilgarvan Show.
- 25.** One attendant will be admitted free with each exhibit.
- 26.** Ground may be uneven, please exercise caution.
- 27.** If you are selling food at the show, you will be required to be Health Service Executive Registered
- 28.** Insurance Indemnity must be on insurance company headed paper or have insurance company stamp impressed thereon.
- 29.** Stand owners/agents must clean up their area before leaving the showgrounds



Department Of Agriculture, Food & the Marine
Note for Information regarding Movement of Bovine to Shows

The Department of Agriculture implemented a number of changes on 4th February 2019 which changed the procedures & criteria applicable when applying for a Certificate of Compliance for the movement of cattle. These also impact on the certificate which is required when moving bovine to a Show.

The following sets out the criteria applicable:

- The movement of cattle to & from an Agriculture Show within the State must be recorded on the Animal Identification & Movement System (AIM)
- In line with these changes a specific certificate of Compliance for the "Movement of Bovine from a Single Holding to a Show" must now be requested prior to the movement of animals concerned.
- These certificates can be created by applying on-line using their agfood account **OR** where the keeper is not on line the certificate can be generated by the local Regional Veterinary Office following receipt of a NBAS31K with issue of the certificate being subject to normal criteria applicable. This form will be available on the Department's Website & will also be included with the Show Circular when issued.
- When applying for this certificate the destination herd/or Show number is not required. The certificate generated will include an "S" symbol.
- **The Certificate of Compliance for a Show will continue to be valid for a period of up to 30 days.** As is currently the case these can be used for the movement of animals to a number of shows during the validity period of the certificate.
- **Please note – calves which are less than 10 days cannot be moved to a show.**

As is currently the case the Movement Notification Section of the Certificate should be completed by the Keeper and the Show Secretary who must clearly indicate the Show Number. The Show movement should be recorded on the passport. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling these requirements lies with the Show Secretary. If the animals move to a herd other than the source herd, the new destination herd must complete and sign the certificate also.

Completed forms should be sent by the Show Secretary to the local RVO within 7 days of the Show.

On the day of the Show, the Certificate of Compliance should be presented to the Show Secretary. The Keeper & the Show Secretary will then sign the Movement Notification section of the Certificate which will then be sent to the local RVO for recording onto the AIM system

The Kilgarvan Show Committee, acting by itself or through its agents/Officers, reserves the right to reject or cancel any entry or entries made by or on behalf of any person, corporate or other entity and may direct the removal of any animal or other exhibit from the showing ring or display area and or from the Showground, if the Committee and or its Agents/Officers shall deem it fit to do so, without offering any explanation or reason for so doing and without incurring any liability whatsoever to any such Applicant/Exhibitor or his/her/its agent.

Please observe signs – especially those relating to caution in livestock area. Please do not exhibit animals that are unsuitable with regard to safety e.g., hard to control. All animals must be led by a competent handler and animals should not be tied to trailers or unsafe items.

Specific Requirements – Sheep

Identification

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS)

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

AIM Notification

The movement of sheep to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. This is done using a copy of the owner sheep dispatch document as follows.

1. The owner/keeper presents the signed and completed dispatch document to the show secretary who checks it to ensure that it is completed in full.
2. The show secretary fills in the MART section of the dispatch document with
 - (A) The show numbers.
 - (B) The date of the move back to the source holding
 - (C) Stamp it with the show stamp
 - (D) Sign the dispatch document
3. The show secretary then forwards the completed pink section of the dispatch document to the local DVO within seven days of the show movement.
4. The show secretary keeps white copy for his/her records
5. The source/destination keeper keeps the bottom yellow copy to enter it into their flock register.

Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

Flock register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Exports to Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a TRACES intra-community trade certificate for ovine animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department Officials of the DVO). Exhibitors are advised to contact the show society in Northern Ireland well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (e.g., premises and sheep status) and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Obey instruction of Stewards and Safety Officers in the Showgrounds.
- This Show urges all its visitors, children, and spectators alike to share the responsibility in ensuring that all safety regulations are obeyed.
- Each child or group of children shall be accompanied by a parent or adult within the show grounds, shall be constantly supervised and kept a safe distance from all animals, vehicles and machinery.
- All animals must be confined to their designated areas and kept under strict control. All animals must be shown at owner's risk. The Society will not be accountable for any accident, damage or loss of exhibit. It is advisable for the exhibitor to have insurance on his animal.
- Members of the public are requested to take reasonable precautions to avoid accidents.
- Speed limits within the grounds must be obeyed, All safety signs within the grounds must be obeyed
- All Cattle must be unloaded in unloading bay.
- All animals being exhibited must be under proper control at all times.
- Members of the Public must not enter Show Judging arenas, Judging Rings or unloading bays for animals.
- Trade Exhibitors must take all reasonable precautions to prevent accidents on their stand.
- Trade Exhibitors must have Safety Statements.
- All accidents must be reported immediately to the Safety Officer.
- All Gazebos' must be secure – in the case of high winds the stewards may ask you not to erect the gazebo or may ask you to take it down.
- Fireworks, pellet guns, bangers, spray paint are not to be sold on stands, **Trade Stands** found to be selling these products will be removed from the Show Grounds
- Ground may be uneven please exercise care.
- In the interest of safety, the Society will reserve the right to refuse entry or have an animal(s) removed from the Showgrounds during the course of the Show.
- Exhibitors are to understand that, although every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure the safety and welfare of the animals and all other Exhibits, the Society will not be responsible for loss or accident of any kind that may occur. Neither will the Society be accountable for any accident that may occur to any persons attending the Show, whether as a visitor, Exhibitor or otherwise.



Discipline

The Irish Show Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and other participants in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour.

Inappropriate behaviour: shall include but not be limited to the following.

- Profanity: coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges or other show officials,
- Harassment or bullying: including using words or actions that threaten intimidate or undermine
- Judges or other officials before during or following Member Show activities.
- Failure to follow rules and /or obey instructions
- Abusing any animal

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Show Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Show Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

Procedure:

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours.

A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said complaint; such reply shall be made in writing

Both parties shall state whether an oral hearing of the complaint is sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to hold an oral hearing in regard to the complaint whether or not sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall decide in each case whether to hold such an oral hearing in respect of the complaint, or any part thereof and there shall be no appeal from such decision of the Disciplinary Committee

The Disciplinary Committee shall, at any time, seek further information from either party. In the event of either party refusing or failing to provide such further information within the time specified by the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee shall be entitled to make a decision on the complaint and/or to hold an oral hearing of the complaint in the absence of a copy of such further information being received by the Disciplinary Committee from either party.

Sanctions:

In the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed to be proved against the offender, the Disciplinary Committee shall issue a written warning to the offender. In the event of any subsequent incident, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose sanctions on the offender, including a prohibition on such offender participating in any of the events/activities at any Member Show of the ISA, provided always that in the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed by the Disciplinary Committee to constitute gross misbehaviour, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the offender as it deems appropriate, including the prohibition on such offender from participating in any of the events/activities of any Member Show of the ISA

The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final:

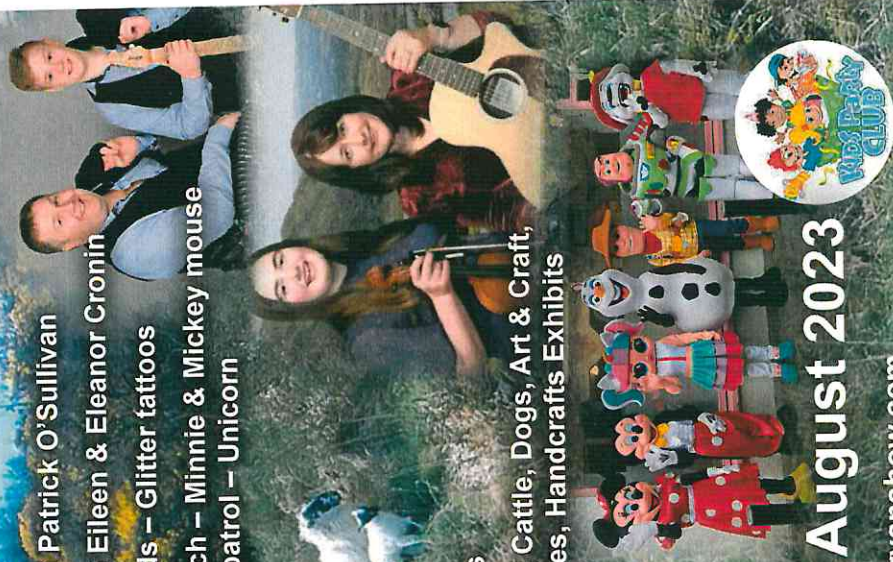
